Regulations on Full Scholarships for Outstanding New Students

October 9, 2018 / Approved by the 1st Program Affairs Meeting of the IMPLAI, 1st Semester, Academic Year 2018.

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May 20, 2026 / Amended and approved by the 2nd Academic Affairs Meeting, 2nd Semester, Academic Year 2025.

Article 1 These regulations are established in accordance with the "National Taipei University of Education Regulations for the Establishment of Full Scholarships for Outstanding New Students."

Article 2 The scholarship recipients shall be newly admitted student(s) enrolled in the full-time master's program of the International Master's Program of Learning and Instruction (hereinafter referred to as "the Program"). However, students who already receive full tuition and credit fee waivers, or those who have been awarded the Taiwan Scholarship, are not eligible.

Article 3 The quota for the scholarship shall be one recipient per academic year.

Article 4 The scholarship amount and duration: This scholarship is awarded in the form of a full waiver of tuition and credit fees, and it cannot be held concurrently with any other on-campus scholarships. The maximum duration of the waiver is two years.

Article 5 The eligibility criteria for the scholarship are as follows:

1. Master's degree students who have been approved for admission to the Program for the current academic year.
2. The eligibility for scholarship renewal requires the student's academic average from the previous semester to rank within the top five of the class, and the academic average must reach 85 points (inclusive) or above.
3. If an outstanding new student does not rank within the top five of that class year but attains an academic average of 85 points (inclusive) or above, "and furthermore" meets one of the following conditions, the student may still renew the scholarship upon discussion and approval by the Program Affairs Meeting: (a) Published at an international conference with anonymous full-text double-blind peer review; or (b) Published in a domestic or international academic journal with anonymous double-blind peer review. Each publication can only be used for a single renewal qualification (the author's institutional affiliation must be credited to the Program).

Article 6 Review Method: The evaluation shall be primarily based on the admission application materials.

Article 7 Award Procedures:

1. The admission review results shall serve as the priority ranking for the scholarship award.
2. The Office of Academic Affairs shall compile the list of newly admitted recipients and submit it to the President for approval, after which a full waiver of tuition and credit fees will be applied.
3. Within one week after the start of the first semester of each academic year and within the deadline announced by the Office of Academic Affairs, the list of students eligible for renewal shall be compiled into a roster and submitted to the Office of Academic Affairs for processing.

Article 8 Target of Scholarship Termination:

1. Students who apply to defer their admission or take a leave of absence during their semester of entry.
2. Students who voluntarily waive the scholarship, or leave the university due to expulsion, transfer, or other reasons during their period of study.
3. Students whose academic performance in the previous semester failed to meet the standards established by the Program.

For scholarships terminated due to the aforementioned reasons, the vacancies shall not be filled by replacement candidates.

Article 9 Matters not covered in these regulations shall be handled in accordance with the university's Academic Regulations and relevant laws and regulations.

Article 10 These regulations shall be implemented upon passage by the Program Affairs Meeting and subsequent review and passage by the Academic Affairs Meeting.

Should any discrepancy or ambiguity arise between the Chinese original text and the English translation, the original Chinese text shall prevail
